# *Hours of Operation*

Monday to Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.,  
on Saturday exclusively for events,  
and on Sunday from 11:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.

Hours are subject to change due to current legal restrictions related to the coronavirus pandemic. Please refer to the website for current opening hours.

# Guests

---

The club and its facilities are reserved exclusively for members and their personal guests, as well as members of our partner clubs and club members from the IAC network.

Guests are only allowed to enter and stay in the club building in the presence of the inviting member. If there are more than three guests, Members Management must be informed in advance. Guests must be registered at the reception desk by name and entered in a guest book with at least a telephone number. Guests arriving at the club house before the hosting member will be asked to wait in the lobby until the member arrives or will be escorted to the member by club staff. Members are responsible for the conduct of their guests in a manner consistent with club life and for their compliance with the House Rules.





# Children

---

Children are welcome when accompanied by their parents.

After 6:00 p.m., children under 12 years of age will still have access to the private rooms and the restaurant. The library and Havana Lounge are reserved for adults.

Supervising adults are asked that extra care be taken with the exhibits and furnishings. With the expansion of the basement, additional areas will be created for children.



# Consideration

---

The club house is a place for relaxation as well as business activities. Members are asked to observe this in their behaviour and to take every care not to disturb other guests in their respective activities.

Business meetings are not allowed in the public club rooms (library, restaurant and Havana Lounge). For this purpose, we keep the conference rooms on the business level available for all members and their guests. These can be booked at any time through the front desk.



# Discretion

---

Cell phones are to be used discretely and are to be kept on silent throughout the club house. Phones are not permitted in the restaurant, library or Havana Lounge. However, talking on the phone without a speaker phone is permitted in the outdoor area, entrance lobby and CartWalk.

If you would like to make undisturbed phone calls, please use the working spaces on the business level. These can be used free of charge for a maximum of 30 minutes. Otherwise, please book a meeting room.

Laptops can be used until 6:00 p.m. in the Havana Lounge and the library, not in the restaurant. Otherwise, only in the working spaces or meeting rooms.



# Photography

---

Photography is permitted in the private rooms only. Photographs may be taken in the CartWalk and in the lobby, provided that the privacy of other members and their guests is respected and the photos are not made public. For private events, photography may also be permitted in the other areas. Separate permission will be granted for this purpose as part of the reservation process.

Excluded are those photos that are commissioned by the club and used in the context of club events for the documentation of club life in club-owned digital or printed media or distributed by the club itself. Members who do not agree to this must notify Membership Management in writing prior to the specific event, otherwise the club may assume consent in the above sense.



# *Furnishings*

---

We ask that furnishings be handled with care.

The vehicles on display are valuable loans from our members and may only be touched by service personnel.



# *Dress Code*

---

Our club house has an elegant and sporting ambience. In order for our members to feel comfortable, we ask that they dress appropriately for this atmosphere. This means no t-shirts without collars, hoodies, sweatpants, gym wear or flip flops in the public areas. Shorts are not permitted after 6:00 p.m.

Of course, appropriate attire may be worn for specific events (e.g., historic motorsports events).



# Dogs

---

Dogs may be brought (exception are the legally defined “dangerous / fighting dog” breeds), provided they are well behaved and kept on a leash.

Dogs are generally not allowed in the public areas of the restaurant (with the exception of the bistro area), library and Havana Lounge after 6:00 pm.



# *Parking*

---

Parking is provided in the designated areas at the front and sides of the club house.

Parking areas may be reserved for special vehicles during events. We ask members and their guests to be aware of this.





# *Smoking*

---

Please note that smoking is only allowed in the Havana Lounge and on the terraces and courtyards.



# Payment

---

Food and beverages at the club may be purchased in cash, by card or by sepa direct debit.

We kindly ask members to indicate any items consumed from the Honesty Bar or the humidor to the service staff.

All members are responsible for the use of their membership card. Loss, theft or similar must be reported to the club immediately. Only the namely mentioned owner of the membership card is allowed to use it.



# Implementation

---

The club staff is required to ensure compliance with the House Rules and may accordingly, at their own discretion and without stating reasons, deny a member or their guest access to the club house or rooms in the club house or eject them from the club house. In the event of violations of the House Rules, the management is entitled to terminate the membership relationship.

The provisions contained in these House Rules have been drawn up to allow all members to enjoy the club facilities in a relaxed atmosphere. They are therefore binding in the current version for all members.
